Summer Camp Guide

Wondering which Summer Camp might be best for your child/children? The following might help you make up your mind.

Please take note of the ages for each camp and any other special requirements, i.e. tap shoes, and snacks, lunches and beverages. The only camp not held at Weatherovane is Hogwarts Summer Studies which is held at King CLC on Memorial Parkway.

Storytime and Imagine THAT! Camps: Chica Chica Boom Boom, Talk to the Animals

If your child/children are between the ages of 3 – 6, have vivid imaginations, and love to tell and create stories, one of these camps might be exactly what you are looking for. These camps use dramatic play, music, dancing, hands-on activities and more, to introduce students to the theater. Through the various activities students learn how to ‘project their voice,’ how to become comfortable on the stage, and how to work and appear with a group of other children. They will tell the story they have created on the last day of camp.

These are one-week camps and students will need to bring a snack for a short snack break.

Kids Take the Stage! Camps: To the Moon and Time Machine

If you have a child or children between the ages of 3 -7 or 8 – 11 who love the thought of shooting into space or time travel, this might be just what you are looking for. Using their imaginations, they will travel either into space or a time machine to another time and participate in interactive theatre activities where they will learn to bring their stories to life. Instructors will work with students to create individual characters and students will learn how to “play their character.” As a group, the students will use different themes to create a story for a presentation on the last day of camp.

Students learn the ins and outs of theatre from creating characters, a script, set pieces, props, and more and have the opportunity to learn and grow as a performer.

These are a two-week camps and students will need to bring a lunch each day.

Stories of Dungeons and Dragons

If your child/children are between the ages of 10 – 17 and love fantasy and the world of Dungeons and Dragons this is where they want to be. Students will use the games' themes and ideas to ignite their imaginations to create stories and characters through improvisation and acting exercises. They will explore the elements of theatre through their journey for treasure or battling deadly foes. Students will use the characters they have created to tell their stories on the last day of camp.

This is a one week camp and students will need to bring a lunch each day.

Jedi Training Camp

If your child/children between the ages of 8 -14 and are fascinated with Star Wars, this camp is the perfect choice. Dressed in robes and light sabers (that are provided), the students will study basic stage combat techniques and create an action story highlighting what they have learned using *The Force*.

This is a one week camp and students will need to bring a lunch each day.

Musical Theatre Cabaret: Juke Box Musicals or Songs that make you 'Smile' and The Greatest Show on Earth

If your child/children between the ages of 5 – 8, 8 – 12 or 12 – 17 and love to sing and dance makes this camp your perfect choice. Students will work on their singing, dancing and acting skills through learning favorite Juke Box, Smile songs, or Circus theme songs. They will present their music and dance skills on the last day.

Each is a one week camp and students will need to bring a lunch each day.

Broadway Boot Camp: Around the World, Rhythms of Robbins, and Singin' in the Rain

If your child/children between the ages of 5 – 8, 8 – 14 or 9 – 15 and love to dance makes this the perfect answer to the summertime blues. Students will explore a variety of dance techniques and music, and will learn how to tell a story using music and dance. They will create choreography using the dance techniques they have learned to tell the story of the music. They will present their dances on the last day of class. Special dance shoes are required for certain camps.

Each is a one week camp and students will need to bring a lunch each day.

Teen Summer Stock: Performance Track and Tech Track

If your student is between the ages of 13 – 17 and loves to perform or if your student is between the ages of 10 – 17 and loves the process of theater – all the visual elements, this is the camp for them. Together these students will create and “put on a show”. Those in the Performance Track will appear as the actors/characters on stage and those in the Tech Track will create the set, costumes, sound, props and lighting to “set the stage.”

This is an intense two-week camp and students will need to bring a lunch each day.

Shakespeare Camp

If your student/students are between the ages of 11 – 17 and are interested in William Shakespeare and his works they will be “right at home” at this camp. Students will study Shakespeare’s plays through script analysis, character development and acting while at the same time studying the dialect and language of his time. Students will perform what they have learned on the last day.

This is a one week camp and students will need to bring a lunch each day.

Hogwarts Summer Studies

If you have a student between the ages of 7 – 12 that loves everything Magic and Potter, then this where your wizard wants to be. Students will be sorted into houses by the sorting hat, and will attend 4 ‘magical’ classes each day. Students can earn a SPEW badge, and house points. Muggle parents, grandparents, brothers, sisters, aunts and uncles are invited to a presentation on the last day so the wizards to show you what they have learned. The house cup and badges will be awarded to the house with the most points at the end of the presentation.

This is a one week camp, held at King CLC and students will need to bring a lunch each day.
