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## from the Directors

Dear Weathervane Family,

As we continue our landmark 90th season and reflect on the journey we shared during the 89th season, we are filled with gratitude for the impact we have created together. This remarkable milestone speaks to our enduring commitment to engaging and enriching Northeast Ohio through the transformative power of theater. Since our founding in 1935, Weathervane Playhouse has produced 817 theatrical plays, musicals, and festivals, bringing stories to life and fostering community connections that resonate far beyond our stage.

Last season presented challenges, including rising production costs and limited fundraising efforts over the past two years, which strained Weathervane's budget. However, thanks to the Board of Trustees' hard work on two fundraising events—Murder on the Weathervane Express, which brought in \$39,000, and Dancing through the Decades, offering \$9,500 in pledges—we managed to catch up on our fundraising deficit. Furthermore, staff-led fundraisers, including the Queen of Hearts Raffle and community initiatives raised over \$20,000.

Despite these challenges, we embraced opportunities through enhanced engagement strategies, innovative programming, and community involvement. We expanded our digital outreach, resulting in a subscription renewal rate of over 74%. We diversified our productions with shows like Aida, Murder on the Orient Express, and The Prom, attracting an array of theatergoers.

As we continue confidently with our 90th season, we are thrilled to produce exciting upcoming shows, including Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, James Baldwin's The Amen Corner, Jersey Boys, Dial M for Murder, and Beautiful: The Carole King Musical. Our educational programs are thriving; over 4,500 students participated in workshops and classes last season, ensuring that Weathervane continues to serve as a cornerstone of creativity and learning in our community.

Our theater is not just a performance space; it has become a hub for community engagement. We are dedicated to building bridges with diverse groups, connecting with local organizations, and offering our facilities for gatherings and collaborations. It's a critical moment for transformation, driven by our commitment to artistic excellence and adaptive leadership.

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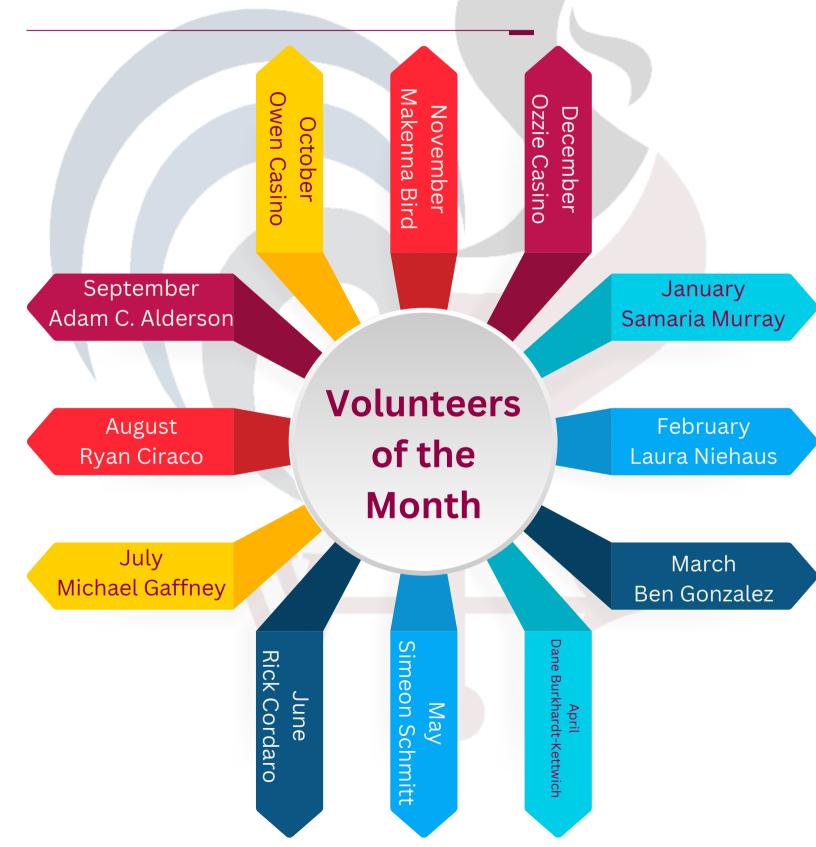

## Volunteers

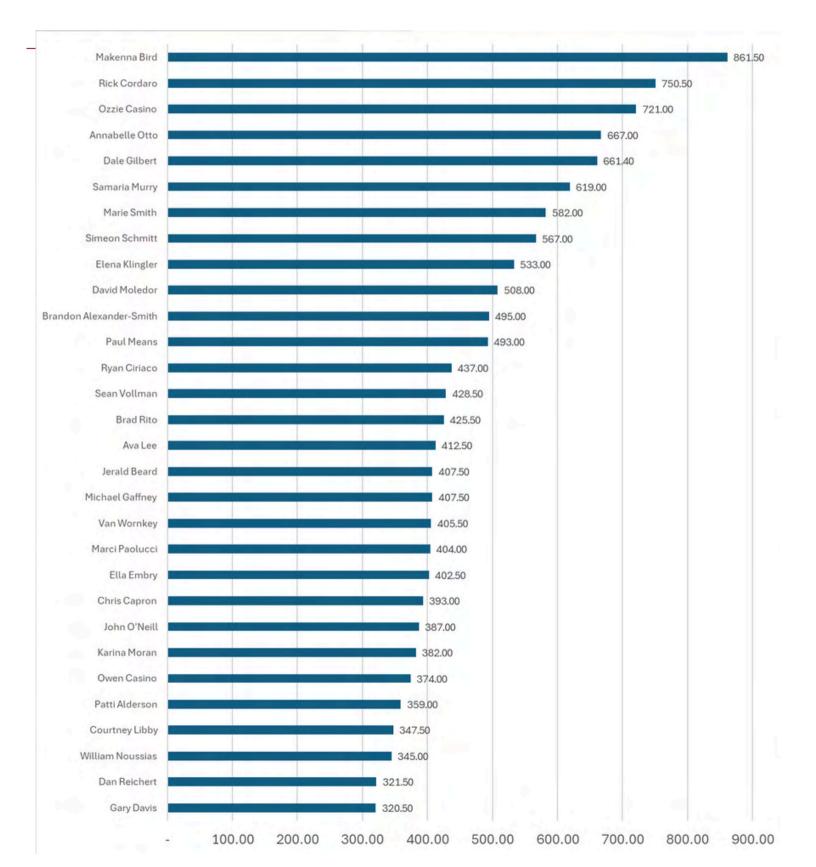

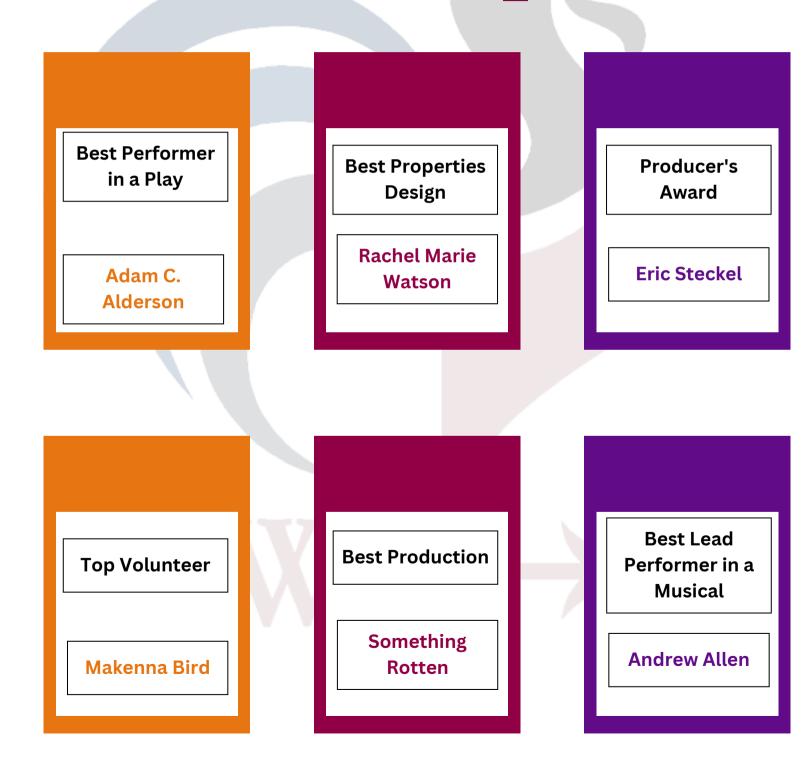
